Payment rates on some allowances are on a graduated basis and qualifying conditions for each benefit and allowance needs to be reviewed on an individual basis with the agency responsible. Aids, Appliances and Assistive Technology

Aids and appliances and assistive technology are recommended based on assessment of need i.e. wheelchairs, standing frames, walkers etc. Applications for funding are made to the HSE. **A child must have a medical card or long term illness card to receive the equipment for free *if* approval is given by HSE. If a child does not have either, parents /carers have to fund purchase.** VAT may be refunded for certain aids, appliances or assistive technology purchased by parents using Form Number: VAT 61A. Online or claim form with supporting documentation to Revenue Commissioners, FREEPOST, Central Repayments Office, M: TEK II Building, Armagh Road, Monaghan H18 YH59. Tel: 047 62100 (Option 6). Alternatively check if claim can be made with health expenses claim or via private medical insurer. The Department of Education may supply aids and appliances for use within the school environment.

Back to School Clothing & Footwear Allowance

This is a means tested allowance intended to help pay the cost of children's school uniforms and footwear. The scheme is administered by the Department of Social Protection and operates from the start of June to the end of September each year. 2025 rates: Children 4—11 years €260; 12 years and over €285. gov.ie/bscfa

Carer's Allowance (means tested)

For parents looking after a child needing full time care & attention. Need to be eligible for Domiciliary Care Allowance if under 16 years. Maximum personal weekly rate for parent under 66 years is €260. Qualified child rate increasing to €50 for under 12 years and €50 for over 12 years in 2025

Recipients **may** be also entitled to Household Benefits package. Separate application when carer's allowance is approved. Apply to Dept. of Social Protection, Carers Allowance Section, Social Welfare Services Office, Government Buildings, Ballinalee Road, Longford (043) 334 0000 / LoCall 1890927770. Carer can attend work or training up to 18.5 hours per week but this must be cleared by the Department of Social Protection as most incomes must be assessed as means. A half rate Carer's Allowance may be paid to carers who are getting or are entitled to another social welfare payment provided they meet the general conditions for the Allowance.

The income disregard for Carer's Allowance will increase from €450 to €625 for a single person and from €900 to €1,250 for a couple. The capital disregard is €50,000

The period during which Carer's Allowance can be paid for children in hospital is 6 months.

Carers Allowance will become a qualifying payment for Fuel Allowance from January 2025.

Carer's Benefit

Maximum personal weekly rate for parent under 66 years is €261 in 2025. Qualified child rate €46 for under 12 years and €54 for over 12 years. Insurance based benefit for people who need to leave employment to look after a child in need of full time care. Duration 24 months but does **not** have to be taken in one block. Carer may work up to 18.5 hours per week although there is a limit on this income and is subject to tax. Carer's Leave legislation has been introduced to protect employment rights - separate application to employer [Carer's leave \(citizensinformation.ie\)](https://www.citizensinformation.ie) See your employer's carer's leave policy also.

Each parent **may** be eligible to apply for a carer's payment but not at the same time.

Carer's Support Grant (Respite Grant) €2,000 in June 2025

The payment is made regardless of the carer's means but is subject to certain conditions. Automatically paid if already in receipt of Carer's Allowance, Carer's Benefit, Domiciliary Allowance, Prescribed Relative Allowance. You do not qualify if you are working more than 18.5 hours per week outside the home, if you are taking part in an education or training course for more than 18.5 hours a week, if you are getting a jobseeker's payment or if you are signing on for jobseeker credits. gov.ie/en/service/16220307-carers-support-grant/

Child Benefit Rates (Monthly)

1 Child €140.00, 2 Children €280.00, 3 Children €420, 4 children €560. Twins paid at 1.5 times the rate & all other multiple births double the rate.

Disability Allowance

Disability Allowance (DA) is a weekly allowance paid to people with a disability. You can get DA from 16 years of age. You can get Disability Allowance even if you are in school. Personal rate €244 per week from Jan '25. Disabled Passengers

Severely disabled persons who use a specially adapted motor vehicle for passengers & who meet certain criteria are entitled to:

- Exemption from VRT subject to maximums
- Refund of VAT on vehicle & adaptations
- Fuel Grant Form DD3
- Exemption from annual motor tax
- Exemptions from toll road fees

Step 1 has been to apply for a Primary Medical Certificate. Applications to Senior Medical Officer, Connolly Street, Cavan. Await outcome. Note includes medical assessment.

Step 2 Identify adaptations needed e.g. contact garage / seller. Step 3 Complete paperwork and forward to Disabled Drivers Section, Central Repayments Office, Revenue Commissioners, M: TEK II Building, Armagh Road, Monaghan (047) 62100 **Form DD1**. Individual Vehicle Approval Certificate required. Vehicle has to be purchased from an authorised dealer and kept for set period. Other conditions apply. Disabled Parking Permit Scheme

Applies to disabled person, not adapted car. Vehicles displaying the permit are entitled to park in public car parking areas in parking bays for disabled persons. May be time limits. Some private car parks may charge. Available to people living in Ireland with a permanent disability, medical condition, severe mobility difficulties and to people who are registered blind, whether they are drivers or passengers. For children under 5 years write to Parking Section, National Mobility Centre, The Irish Wheelchair Association, Ballinagappa Road, Clane, Co. Kildare briefly outlining reasons (enclose SAE) or email parkingcard@ddai.ie and they may send out application form to be completed. Domiciliary Care Allowance (DCA) €360.00 per month DCA is a monthly payment for a child aged under 16 with a severe disability, who requires ongoing care and attention, substantially over and above the care and attention usually required by a child of the same age. It is not means tested. The child must be likely to require this level of care and attention for at least 12 months. For more information contact Domiciliary Care Allowance Section,

DCA will be available for babies who remain in an acute Hospital after birth for a period of 6 months.

Medical cards are now granted to all children receiving DCA. Separate application. Not means tested.

Drugs Payment Scheme

Covers families and individuals for the cost of prescribed medication. Under the terms of the scheme, no individual or family will have to pay more than €100 (reducing to €80) in any calendar month for approved prescribed drugs, medicines and appliances. Free Preschool (ECCE) Children can start in free preschool (15 hours per week) after they reach 2 years 8 months. Enrolment for September only. Usually for 2 years. Applications for additional support for children with special needs can be made by preschool service. See aim.gov.ie or cavanccc.ie

Employing a Carer see revenue.ie

You, your spouse or civil partner may claim tax relief if you employ someone to care for a family member who is incapacitated. Check website as there are many conditions attached. Tax relief is only available against income tax paid.

European Health Insurance Card

The European Health Insurance Card allows the holder to access health care services when travelling to other EU countries. Apply online www.hse.ie in person or by post. See www2.hse.ie/services/ehic/ehic.html

Home Carer's Tax Credits see revenue.ie

To claim the Home Carer Tax Credit you must care for a dependent person. You must also be married or in a civil

partnership and be jointly assessed for income tax. To qualify for the full tax credit the home carer's income must not exceed €7,200 in the tax year. Where the home carer's income is between €7,200 and €10,200 the tax credit is reduced. Apply on my Account. Maximum rate in 2024 is €1700. If your income is €10,600 or more during 2024 then you cannot claim the tax credit.

Housing Adaptation Grant for People with a Disability

Grant for adaptation / extension of house to facilitate disabled person. Means tested. Does not cover full costs of renovation. Enquiries to Cavan County Council (049) 4378300/ Housing 0494378322 [Housing grants - Cavan County Council \(cavancoco.ie\)](#)

Incapacitated Child Tax Credit

If you are the parent of a child who is “permanently incapacitated” you can claim an additional allowance of €3500. See criteria on revenue.ie/en/personal-tax-credits-reliefs-and-exemptions/children/incapacitated-child-credit/index.aspx Requires form signed by medical practitioner.

Local Property Tax

Long Term Illness Card

Entitles child to free medication associated with illness. Also applies to aids and appliances. Disabilities / illnesses listed as eligible include Phenylketonuria, Hydrocephalus, Acute Leukaemia, Multiple Sclerosis, Cystic Fibrosis, Cerebral Palsy, Diabetes Mellitus, Muscular Dystrophies, Spina Bifida, Epilepsy, Diabetes Insipidus, Mental Illness (under 16 years) Haemophilia, Parkinsonism, Mental Handicap, Conditions arising from the use of Thalidomide. ADHD added. Download the application form from www2.hse.ie/services/long-term-illness-scheme/long-term-illness.html

Medical Card holders are entitled to free GP services, community services, dental services, hospital care and a range of other benefits. Also reduced prescription medicine costs. Means test applied but exceptional circumstances applications can be made.

G.P Visit Card If you have a GP visit card, you don't have to pay to see your doctor. You will have to pay for medicines and other services. If you have a medical card, you don't need a GP visit card. You qualify in much the same way as qualifying for a medical card except the income guidelines are higher. Children under 6 years who do not have a medical card are eligible to get a GP Visit card. Parents must apply for GP Visit Card. In **Budget 2022**, it was announced that free GP care was extended to include children aged 6 and 7. If you get **Carer's Benefit or Carer's Allowance** you can visit your GP for free. For medical or GP visit card apply online ww.medicalcard.ie / call 1800700700/ post the completed form to the National Medical Card Unit, PO Box 11745, Dublin 11, D11 XKF3. Medical Card and GP Visit Card holders aged under 70 years pay a charge of €1:50 per prescription item, subject to a monthly ceiling of €15 per person / family.

Medical Expenses IT 6—Claim via Tax Return Form on myAccount & MED 2

If you are paying tax you may be able to reclaim health & medical expenses. Claims for tax relief must be made within 4 years after the end of the tax year to which the claim relates so if you haven't claimed for previous years you can still do so. A Guide to claiming Health/ Medical Expenses Relief (IT6) is available online on revenue.ie - Personal Tax link. Qualifying health expenses include Physiotherapy, Educational Psychologists and Speech & Language Therapy costs. Doctors & consultants fees, drugs & medicines, Medical & other appliances. Children with permanent disabilities and life threatening illnesses – includes information on claiming travel expenses to hospital appointments, overnight accommodation, telephone expenses, hygiene products & special clothing.

See other categories also. If you have private health insurance check if you have cover for therapy expenses.

Assistance dogs for adults and children—If you require a trained service dog or assistance dog, you may claim €825 per year. You can use myAccount to claim this allowance.

Mobility Aids Grant Scheme

Scheme which provides grants for work designed to address mobility problems in the home. E.g. stair lift, grab rails, ramps etc. Cannot apply for both the Mobility Aids Grant Scheme and the Housing Adaptation Grant for People with a Disability. Maximum grant available €6,000. Means tested—household income of less than €30,000 per year. Application forms from Cavan County Council (049) 4378300/4358325. housinggrants@cavancoco.ie

Nappies / Incontinence Supplies for children over 3 years.

Contact your Public Health Nurse at local Health Centre to discuss criteria. Let Public Health Nurse know if you have Domiciliary Care Allowance, Medical Card or Long Term Illness Card.

National Childcare Scheme www.ncs.gov.ie

This is the first ever statutory entitlement to financial support for childcare. It establishes an equitable and progressive system of universal and income-related subsidies for children up to the age of 15. This scheme provides financial support for parents towards the cost of childcare. Universal subsidies are available to all families with children between 24 weeks and 15 years of age. This subsidy is not means tested and provides €1.40 per hour towards the cost of a registered childcare place for a maximum of 45 hours per week, rising to €2.14 per hour in September 2024.

Income Assessed Subsidies are available to families with children aged between 24 weeks and 15 years. This subsidy is means tested and will be calculated based on your individual circumstances. Your rate will vary depending on your level of family income, your child's age and educational stage, and the number of children in your family.

Parental Leave

Parental leave entitles parents to take unpaid leave from work to spend time looking after their children. You can take up to 26 weeks' parental leave for each eligible child before their 12th birthday or 16th birthday if your child has a disability. Parents Leave & Parents' Benefit

Parent's leave entitles each parent to 7 weeks' leave, increasing to 9 weeks from August 2024 during the first 2 years of a child's life, or in the case of adoption, within 2 years of the placement of the child with the family.

Parent's Benefit is paid while you are on parent's leave from work if you have enough social insurance (PRSI) contributions.

Preschool support and Home Support

Support in preschool should be discussed with your child's preschool service.

Home Support for children with disabilities is funded by HSE, Cavan/Monaghan Disability Services, application for same is subject to assessment by the HSE and if approved services that are provided vary, depending on individual needs. Please discuss with the Children's Disability Network Team for further details. If you have private health insurance check with your insurer if you have any cover for home nursing support.
