- 595,355 people in Ireland reported having a disability in Census 2011
 - -13% of the population.



- 5% of children between o-14 years have a disability.
- People with disabilities are twice as likely to live below the poverty line.



• At least 1 in 10 adults of working age have a disability (15-64).
