Congratulations to Aisling on winning best poster presentation at the CRC conference in October. Aisling's poster outlined her work on Teaching Independent Cycling to children with Ambulant Cerebral Palsy. She has produced a two part video series exploring teaching children with ambulant Cerebral Palsy how to ride a bike. Part 1 reviews considerations of what to look for in bike set-up, size and design of bike. Part 2 was produced by 3 children who use Enable Ireland Service and they teach the specific skills required and stages of learning to cycle independently. Viewers are also shown various adaptions which can be made to bikes which can be useful especially for children with hemiplegia. Check the resources out by scanning the QR codes below.

The model achieves this by providing universal supports to pre-school settings, and targeted supports, which focus on the needs of the individual child, without requiring a diagnosis of disability.



| Event | Ages | Group | Description |

| Decider | 12-18 yrs | Targeted | The Decider Skills use Cognitive Behavioural Therapy to teach children, young people and adults skills to recognise their own thoughts, feelings and behaviours, allowing them to monitor and manage their own emotions and mental health. This programme ran for 12 weeks over March, April & May 2025. |
| Sensory Workshop | All ages | Targeted | Sensory Intervention Programme. At the parent training we will come together to learn how to recgonise the body's sensses and how sensory processing works. Connect with other parents in a supportive enviroment. If you attend the training you received a follow up 1:1 Occupation Therapy Intervention at the Sensory Clinic. This ran in March and April 2025. |
| Easter Event | All ages | All | Our first Easter CDNT community event was held on Wednesday April 16 th . This event provided service users access to supportive Easter activities within a safe structured environment . We hope you all had fun. |
| Parent Support Sessions | All ages | Targeted | The aim of these sessions is to give parents/carers some time for themselves. To provide an opportunity for parents/carers to meet and share common experiences and ideas. There are three sessions, two sessions have already run and the third session will be run on Friday 23 rd May 2025. |
| Visuals | 6-12 | Targeted | Visual supports are beneficial for children and families, aiding, attention, listening, communication, independence, emotional, regulation, behaviour management, and understanding social interaction differences. This program ran on Friday 7th March 2025. |
| Postive Mealtimes | All | Targeted | Mealtimes can be a difficult time, with some of our children experiencing, preferences around the types of foods that they eat . This series of workshops aims to offer you some strategies and ideas support positive mealtimes for you and your child. This was run in February & April 2025 over two sessions. |

| Transition to Primary School | 22nd May 2025 | 4-6 yrs | Targeted | This workshop will focus on: - Concerns you may have - Ideas to help support your child - Practical strategies - Communication passport - Essential skills - Social Stories This workshop is aimed at parents of children who are entering Primary School this coming September 2025. |
| Busy Fingers July 2025 | July 2025 | 4-12 yrs | Targeted | The programme will focus on developing your child's fine motor and handwriting skills. We will work on these skills through fun games and practical activities. Activities chosen will help build your child's confidence and self- esteem. The programme will be offered through either group or individual sessions based on your child's needs. Running throughout July 2025. |
| Transition to Secondary School | August 2025 | 12 yrs + | Targeted | This 2 session (3 hours per session) group focused on helping the young teens to prepare for the transition to secondary school and some of the changes and worries that might come with this. Provisionally this will be scheduled the week of August 11 th 2025' |




Learn 2 Cycle Taster Sessions
